Message from the Chief:

We started the year with 5 vacancies for officer positions and ended with one opening. Through no small effort, eight new officers were hired in 2023 which helped offset the three retirements and one resignation. In a positive change for hiring practices, two police recruits were hired in 2023 and sent to the Ohio State Highway Patrol Basic Police Academy, and one recruit was hired while in a local academy. Unfortunately, two officers have already provided 2-week notices for early January 2024. These two openings, the addition of a 44th sworn officer to our roster, and the outstanding opening will mean that we will have 4 officer vacancies in early January 2024.

Major projects completed in 2023 included rewriting our mission statement through a collaborative process that included employees and the community. Another project started when officers recognized the value of stationary license plate readers during crime investigations after using neighboring jurisdictions. After presenting the capabilities and safeguards to the City Council, the police department was authorized to lease nine (9) Flock stationary license plate readers were installed throughout the City. They have solved a multitude of crimes that probably would have gone unsolved. The last project of note was that all duty firearms were replaced in 2023. All officers used to carry the Gen 3, approximately 10-year-old Glock 40 cal., model 23, now officers have a choice between the SigSaur P320 or the FN 509, both with red dot sites and in 9 mm. This change appears to have improved the officers' accuracy and lowered ammunition costs.

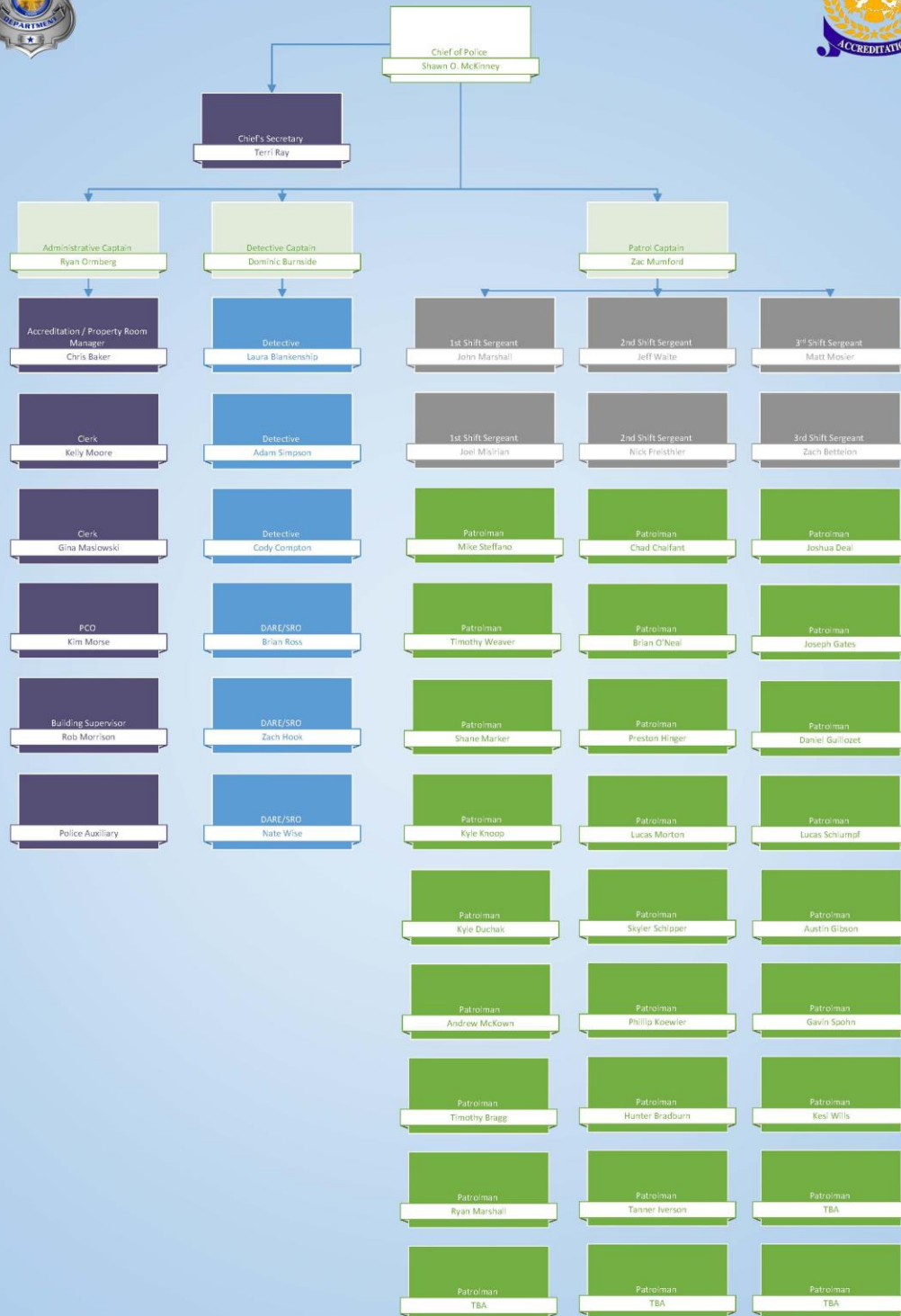
Police Chiefs

The first Town Marshall was John Putterbaugh elected by Council in 1830. A Town Marshall would continue to be elected by the Troy Council until 1874. Starting in 1874 the Town Marshall was elected to a two-year term by popular vote until 1900. In 1900 George Irwin was appointed the first Chief of Police after serving as Town Marshall since 1884.

Administration Section

The Administrative Section was under the command of Captain Ryan Ormberg. Its primary responsibilities include records, parking control, hiring, Accreditation, and building maintenance.

In 2023, the records section responded to and provided 1,570 records requests. These requests can be as simple as a copy of a report or the time-consuming redactions for body camera footage. One trend that was noted is the increase in requests from people across the country that post videos to internet sites such as YouTube.

The Records Section is responsible for several other duties, including the disposal of unclaimed and abandoned junk motor vehicles. In 2023 the Department disposed of 61 vehicles. The process is both time-consuming and creates significant postage costs. The postage costs in 2023 were \$710.87.

Vendor's (door-to-door sales) permits and food truck permits are processed by the Records Section and approved by the Chief of Police. The Police Department conducts local record checks and a \$25 application fee is required. In 2023 there were 8 vendor's license applications, 1 was denied, for a total income of \$175. Ten (10) food truck applications were approved for a total of \$250 collected in application fees.

The Administrative section is responsible for two programs for which we receive grant money reimbursements. The first is a combination of Federal and State reimbursements for bullet-proof vests. By both contract and manufacturer's recommendation, our officers receive a new vest every 5 years. Under both of these programs, we received \$3,827.64 back in 2023.

The second program is the Quick Response Team (QRT) which began in 2016 with the Fire Department and Miami County Recovery Council. The team attempts to contact victims of overdoses and anyone else who may benefit from addiction recovery services inside the City of Troy. The costs

associated with the team are reimbursable through a State Drug Abuse Response Team (DART) grant through the Ohio Attorney General's Office. The Administrative section is in charge of the applications and considerable reporting requirements. Last year \$11,758 in costs were reimbursed through the grant.

1,493 parking tickets were issued throughout the City by both officers and the parking control officer. Fines paid directly to the Police Department totaled \$27,290 in 2023, compared to \$25,440 in 2022, or a 7.3% increase in fines collected. Parking tickets not paid to the Police Department are filed in Municipal Court. This included a moratorium on time-limited parking enforcement from October 3, 2023, until December 31, 2023. The moratorium was meant to be a relief to business owners in the area of the W. Main St. street closure prompted by the building issues at 112-118 W. Main St.

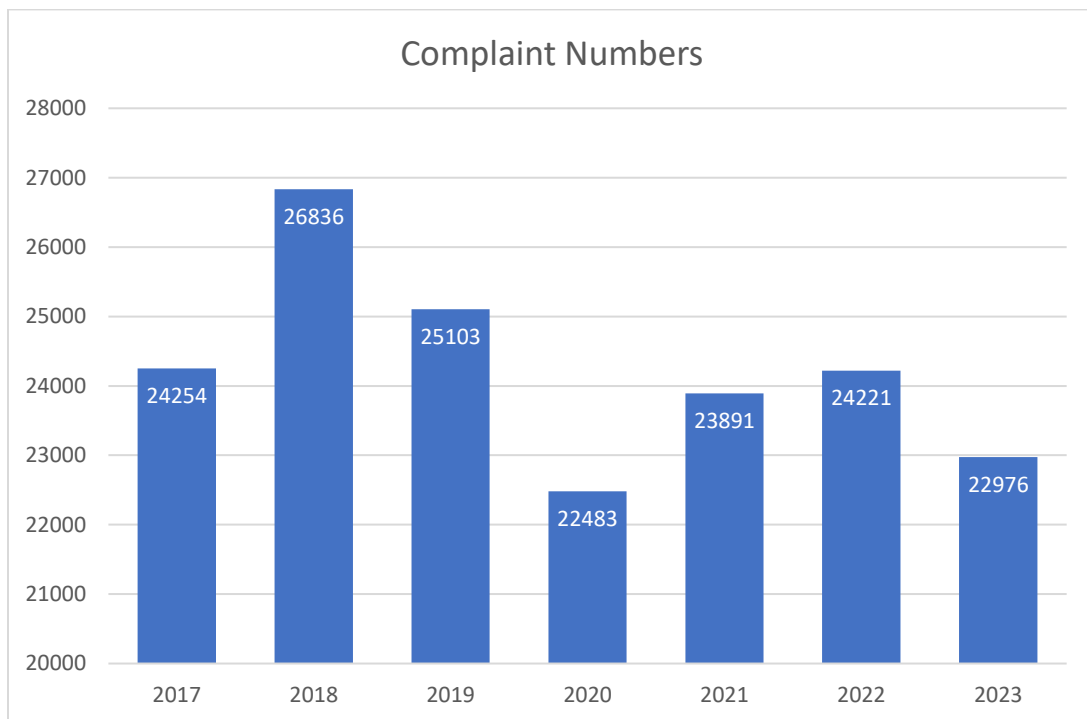
Twenty-two (22) slow-moving vehicles were inspected in 2023 for a total income of \$440.

Major building projects in 2023 included the final stage of flooring replacement, painting the interior of the building, and improvements to the workout room. We also continued to monitor, plan for, and update the HVAC systems.

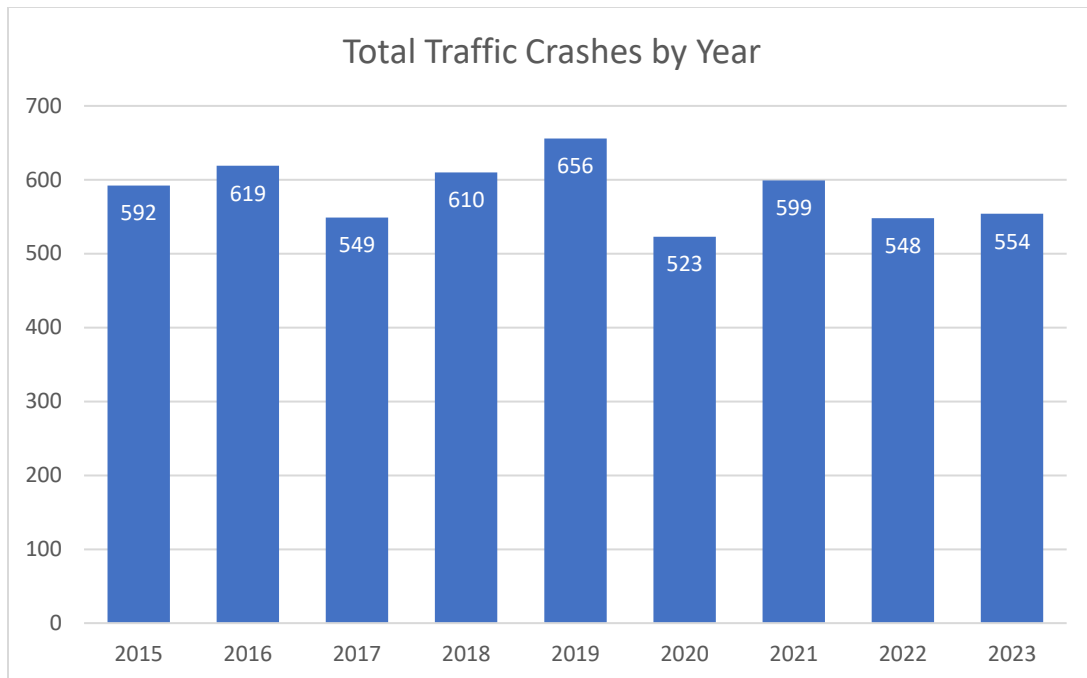
Patrol Section

The Patrol Section was under the command of Captain Zac Mumford in 2023.

Reporting to the Patrol Captain are 6 sergeants and 26 patrol officers. In 2023 they were divided into 3 shifts, each led by 2 sergeants. The year started with 4 vacant positions in the Patrol Section. Despite 8 new hires for the year, the Department ended 2023 with 4 open positions.

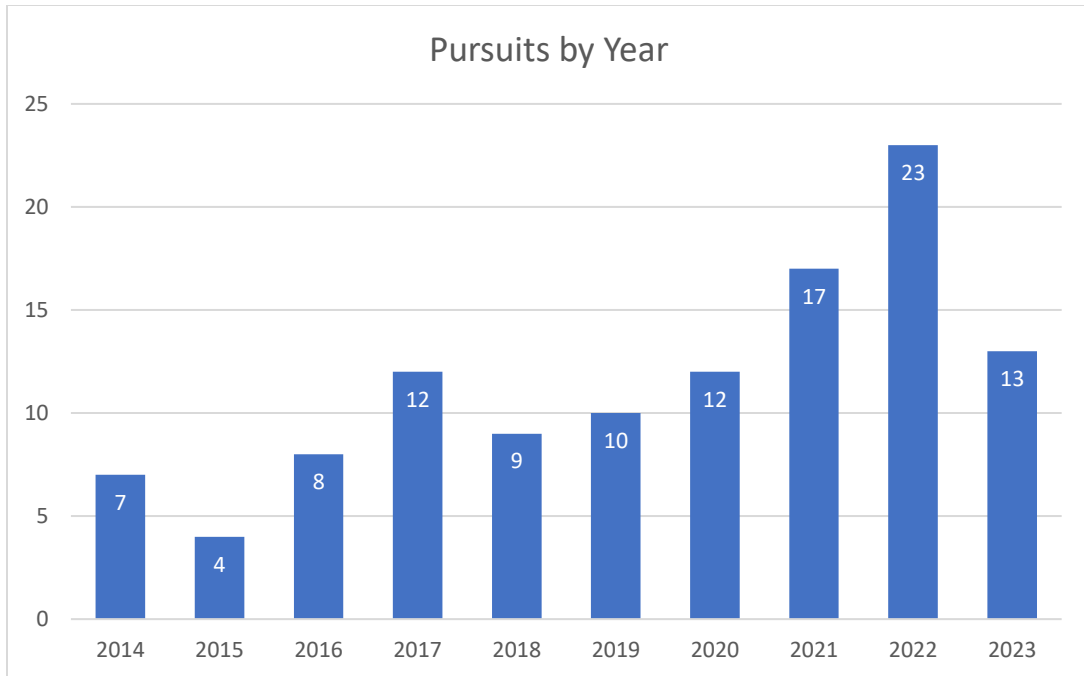


One measure of activity is the number of complaint numbers generated per year. The usual way in which a complaint number is generated is through a call for service handled by the Patrol Section. In 2023 there were 22,976 complaint numbers generated. This represents a decrease of 1,245 complaint numbers from 2022 or a 5.1% decrease. Making this the second lowest year recently, with only 2020 having fewer complaint numbers.



One of the Patrol Section's key responsibilities is the investigation of traffic crashes and the enforcement of traffic laws to reduce crashes. In 2023, the Troy Police Department completed 554 traffic crash reports. This represents a 0.1% increase in traffic crashes in 2022. The three highest crash locations were W. Main St./Experiment Farm Rd. (28), W. Main St./Adams St. (20), and the Public Square (19). Officers made 4,734 traffic stops, issuing 1771 traffic citations, and 3886 warnings in 2023.

Four fatal traffic-related crashes occurred inside the City in 2023. On March 3rd, 2023 a vehicle struck a tree in the parking lot of The Flats apartment complex at 455 Stonyridge Ave, killing the driver and only occupant. On March 6th, 2023, a juvenile on a bicycle was hit by a pickup truck in a parking lot of a local park. The driver of the pickup, also a juvenile, was charged with aggravated vehicular homicide and OVI. On March 13th, an SUV struck a power pole in the area of 1325 McKaig Ave., killing the driver, who was the sole occupant. Lastly, on Thanksgiving Day a car ran into a home at the intersection of S. Elm St. and McKaig, causing only minor damage, but the driver died. His death was determined to have been caused by a medical condition, and not a result of the crash.



Pursuits decreased in 2023 with a 43% decrease over 2022. Officers terminated the pursuit in 9 of the 13 cases. See the Patrol Captain's annual pursuit review for a more in-depth analysis. The new pursuit policy was enacted allowing for several stopping techniques taught by the State of Ohio, including the PIT (Precision Immobilization Technique) maneuver.

Investigative Section

The Detective Section is primarily responsible for investigations and the School Resource Officer program. Sgt. Dominic Burnside was the interim head of the Detective Section beginning in 2023 and was promoted to Captain on March 13, 2023. He then stayed in command of the Detective Section.

While all patrol officers are encouraged to investigate the calls they are dispatched to, the most serious cases and any prolonged or extended investigation are usually assigned to the Detective Section. There were 2 new detectives for the majority of 2023, a reduction of one due to staffing shortages, and the 3 School Resource Officers (SRO). Toward the end of 2023, the 3rd detective position was filled.

Of the three SRO's, one is assigned to the High School, one is assigned to the Middle School, and one is assigned to the elementary schools. The elementary school SRO, Tracy Long retired at the end of the 2022-2023 school year and Officer Nate Wise was appointed the new SRO over the summer. SRO Hook remained at the High School and SRO Brian Ross continued at the Junior High School.

Because of staffing shortages, the SRO's were assigned to the Patrol Section over the summer. This meant that their summer programs were cut back to only Safety Town, eliminating crime scene and bike camp. Other community service events that the SRO's organized or participate in included the National Night Out Against Crime, and Trunk or Treat with Children's Services.

In addition to the numerous cases that detectives assisted the Patrol section with, and while working one detective short, with entirely new staff they were assigned 92 higher profile/more complicated cases in 2023 and the SRO's worked 39 cases, the majority that came from the High School. The section also provided active shooter training to 8 businesses and 2 schools.

In the summer of 2023, the detectives followed up on a series of thefts from and of motor vehicles that plagued the greater Dayton & Cincinnati areas. Troy Detectives identified subjects involved in the theft rings which resulted in the arrest/charges of 4 subjects (1 adult male and 3 juvenile males) involved in vehicle thefts from Troy. Additionally, Troy Detectives became the lead investigators and points of contact for outside agencies as they were able to identify subjects responsible for the outside affected areas as well.

Another major case involved a sexual assault investigation in which Troy Detectives apprehended an adult male who ultimately confessed to sexually assaulting a minor. Troy Detectives learned the same male had been the target of a sexual assault sting operation in Montgomery County just 2 weeks prior. The investigation led to the male's felony conviction and being sentenced to prison. The investigation was also featured on Chris Hansen's TV show, *"Take Down,"* formerly known as, *"To Catch a Predator."*

The Investigative Section continued and strengthened its relationship with the relatively newly formed Child Advocacy Center located in Troy. Our Detectives worked 40 cases with the multi-disciplinary team when children either witnessed violence or were victims of crimes.

Training

Highlights of training this year.

- *Every officer attended 24 hours of State mandated Continuing Profession Training (CPT)*
- *4 in-service training days were held that included defensive tactics, Taser and other less-than-lethal weapons, SIMS rounds scenarios (active shooter), mental health, using an AED, first aid, ethics, driving, deployment of stop sticks, riot control, and new firearms familiarization.*

Staffing Levels

Police Departments nationwide continue to struggle with hiring qualified candidates. As mentioned in the Message from the Chief, the Troy Police Department, led by the Administrative Section, hired 8 officers in 2023.

The last time that the number of officers was added to the Police Department was 1998 despite the steady population growth of the City. U.S. Census records indicate that Troy's estimated population in 1998 was 21,672. The 2023 U.S. Census population estimate for Troy is 26,679, approximately a 23% increase in population.

The approved 2024 budget adds a sworn officer position, which will add unit #444 to our roster. The budget also sets forth plans to transition the role of Property Room and Accreditation Manager to an additional non-sworn staff position in 2025. This will effectively increase the number of officers in an enforcement role.

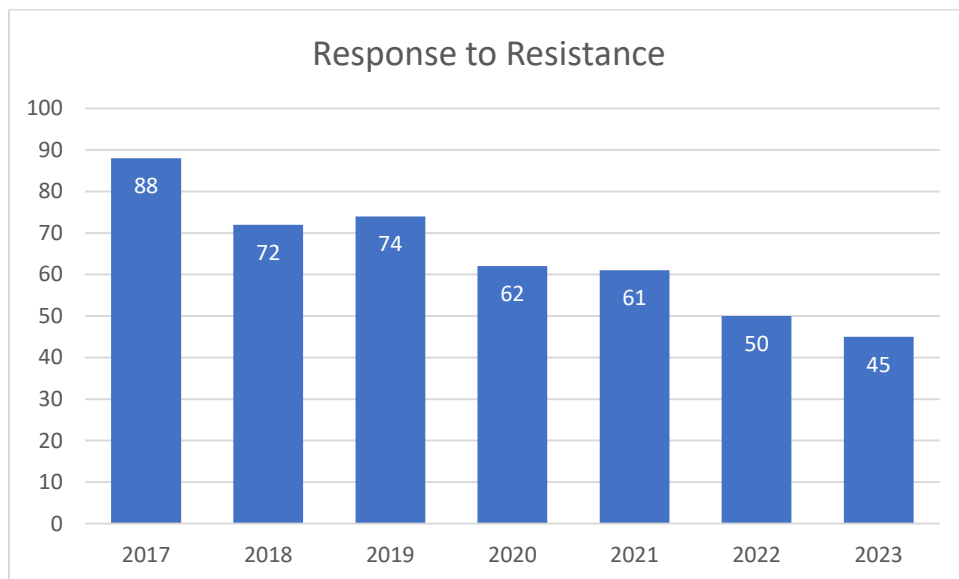
Accreditation

The Troy Police Department maintained its accreditation through the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA) and Ohio Collaborative. In 2016 the Department's CALEA accreditation transitioned from a 3-year process to a 4-year process. Since 2016 the Department has had an annual web-based review of approximately ¼ of CALEA's standards and a site-based assessment every 4 years by outside assessors. The last site-based assessment was in 2020. During the 2023 web-based assessment, 191 standards were reviewed. There were concerns with 2 standards, which we believe have been corrected at this time. The Troy Police Department has maintained CALEA Accreditation since 1993.

Recruiting

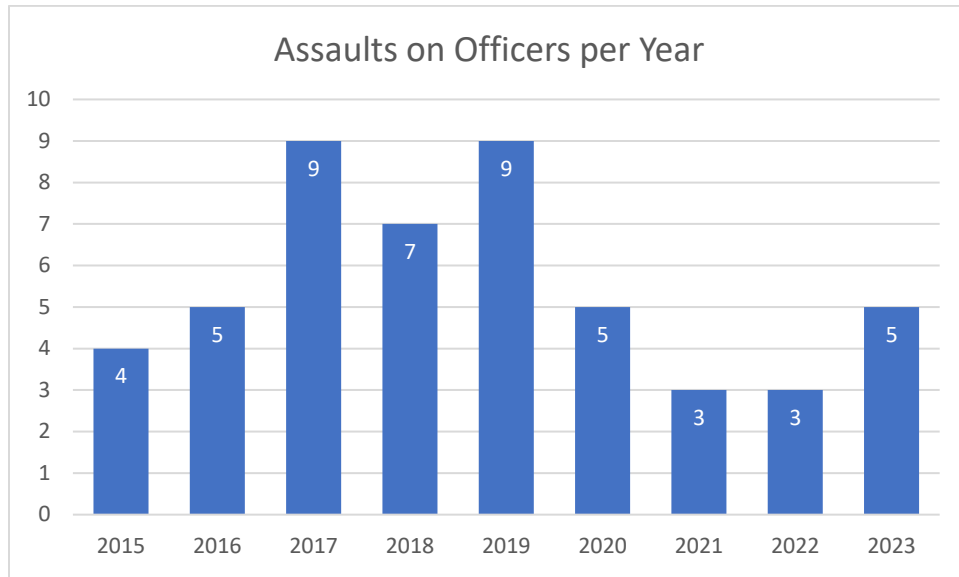
Recruiting continues to be a challenge, specifically the recruitment of minority and female candidates to meet our goal of a workforce that proportionally reflects the composition of the City of Troy's population. Changes made in 2022 were applied in 2023 with the hiring of 3 police recruits. Recruits are candidates who are not State certified and we send them to a police academy while paying them wages and benefits. What appears to be an initial success of these new policies, two of the three police recruits were minority candidates.

Response to Resistance



The Department tracks and reviews internally all uses of force (Response to Resistance). In 2023 there were 45 use-of-force reports. This represents a 10% reduction in the use of force and a continued downward trend since 2017. The Department further examines its response to resistance in the annual Use of Force Analysis completed by the Patrol Captain in January of each year.

Assaults on Officers



Five (5) officers were assaulted in 2023 representing a 67% increase from 2022. It is still slightly below the previous 5-year average of 5.4 officer assaults per year. The Department further examines assaults on officers which is completed by the Patrol Captain in January of each year.

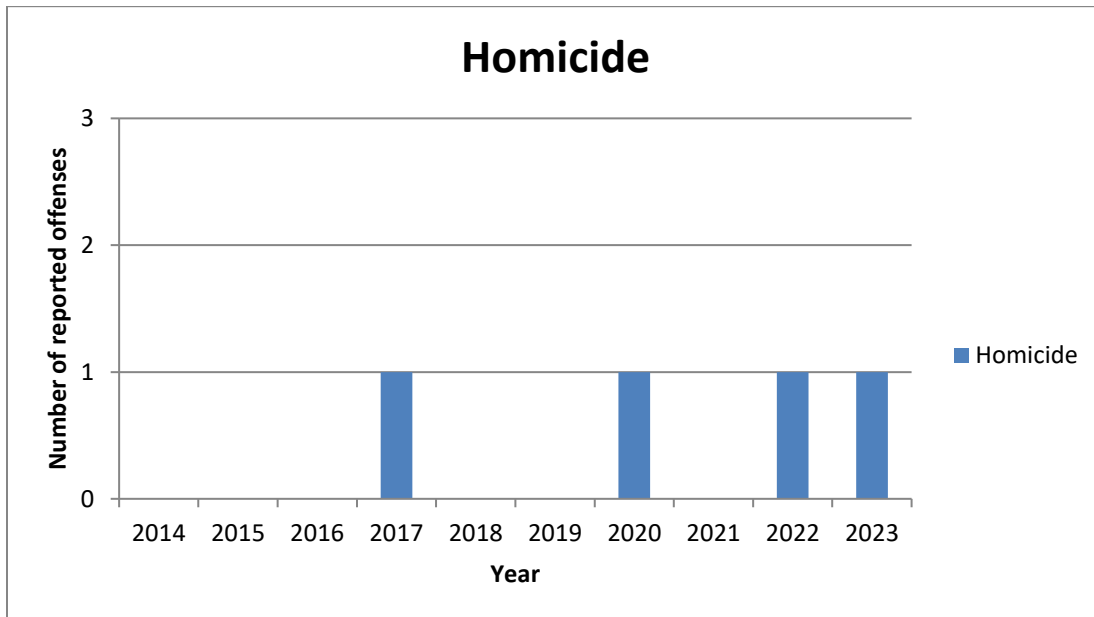
Annual reports before 2022 have always analyzed complaint numbers generated by the police department divided into 30 geographic grids of varying geographic sizes and populations. In the year 2022 attempts were made to track the total number of complaint numbers in each political ward of the City, excluding calls to the police station. Each City ward has approximately the same population, 4,400 residents. Set-up errors questioned the accuracy of the 2022 numbers but were corrected in early 2023.

Ward 2 had the highest amount of calls with 5,117, followed by Ward 5, then Ward 4. One interesting note is the highest amount of calls in Ward 2, as listed in the attachment in the appendix labeled, “Law Incident Analysis, by Location (Ward) and Time” was between midnight and 0059 hrs. See the appendix for a current ward map.

Another analysis in the appendix shows Wednesday was the busiest day of the week for all activity and the hours of 1500 to 1559 hrs. was the busiest time during the week. When compared to disturbance calls, Saturdays become the busiest day of the week, and 1900 to 1959 hrs. is the most likely time that disturbances occur during the week.

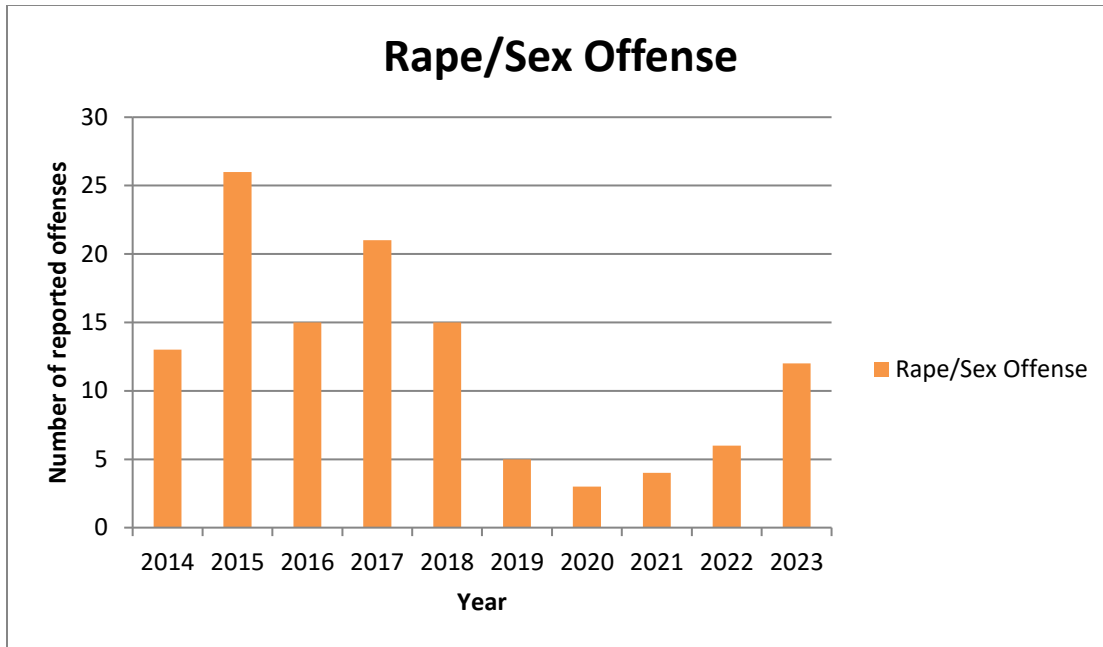

Part 1 Crimes



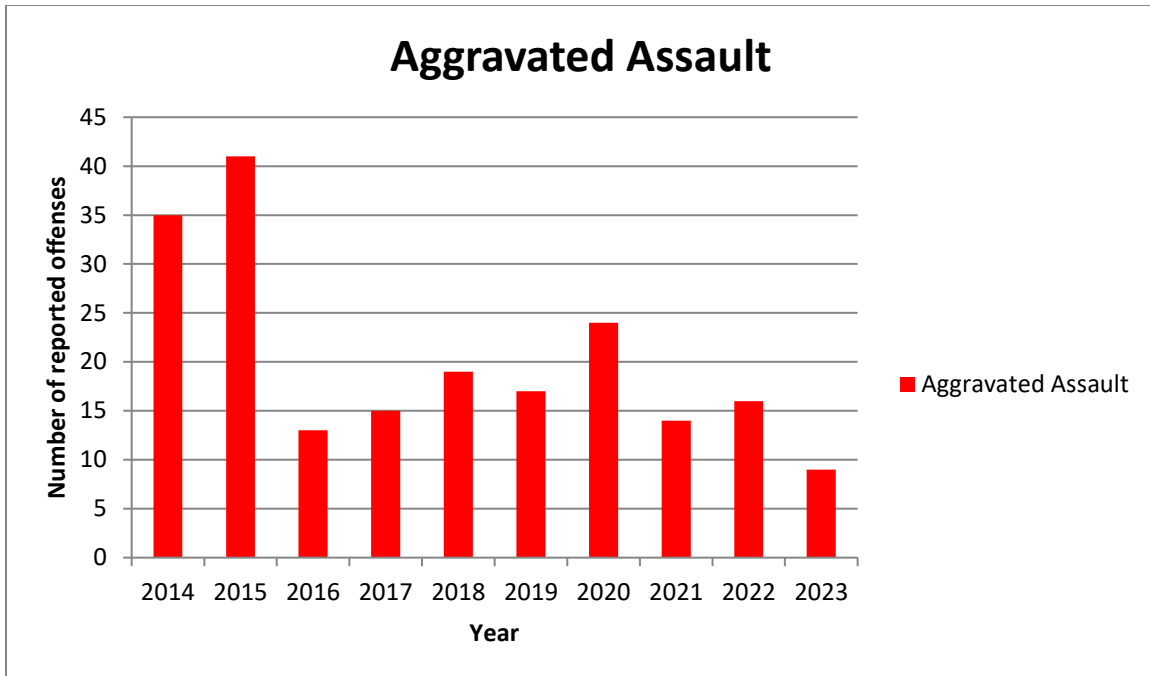
Homicides: There was one homicide reported in Troy in 2023. In the past 10 years, there have been 4 homicides reported in Troy, all have been cleared by arrests.

- March 6, 2023 Aggravated Vehicular Homicide of a juvenile
- April 14, 2022 Aggravated Murder of Easton Ho
- December 14, 2020 Involuntary Manslaughter of Nicholas Walker (Overdose)
- December 8, 2017 Involuntary Manslaughter of Willard Higgins

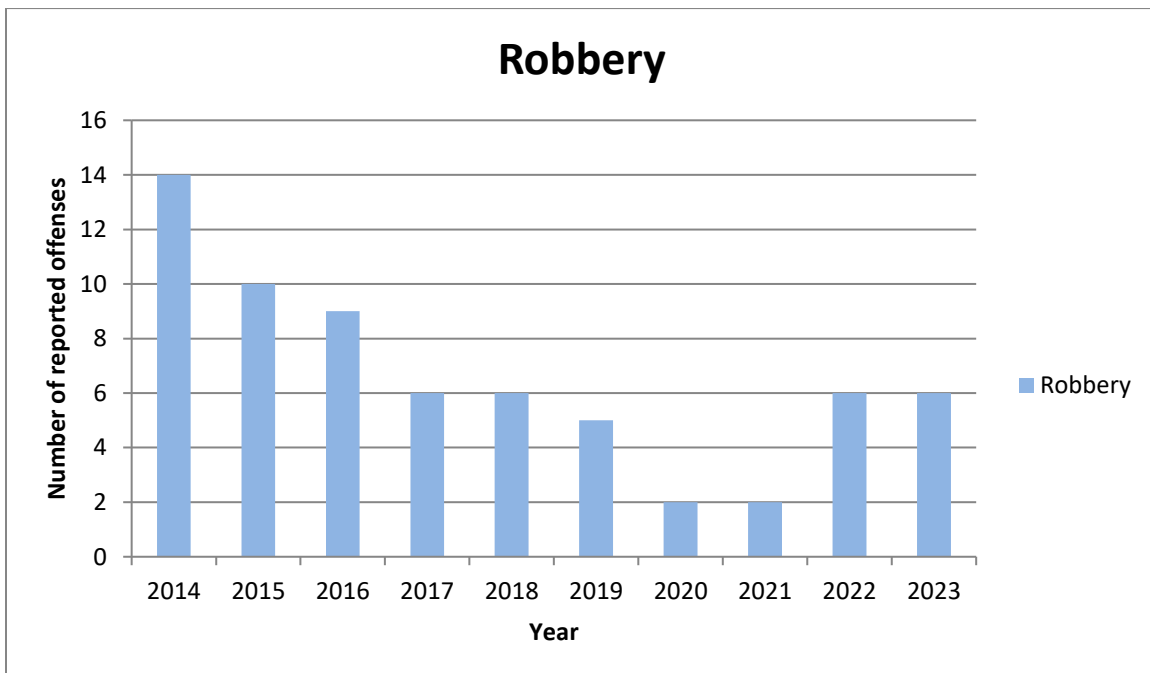


Rape: There were 12 reported sex offenses in Troy in 2023. This represents a 100% increase from 2022 and 81% increase in the past 5-year average. Other facts include:

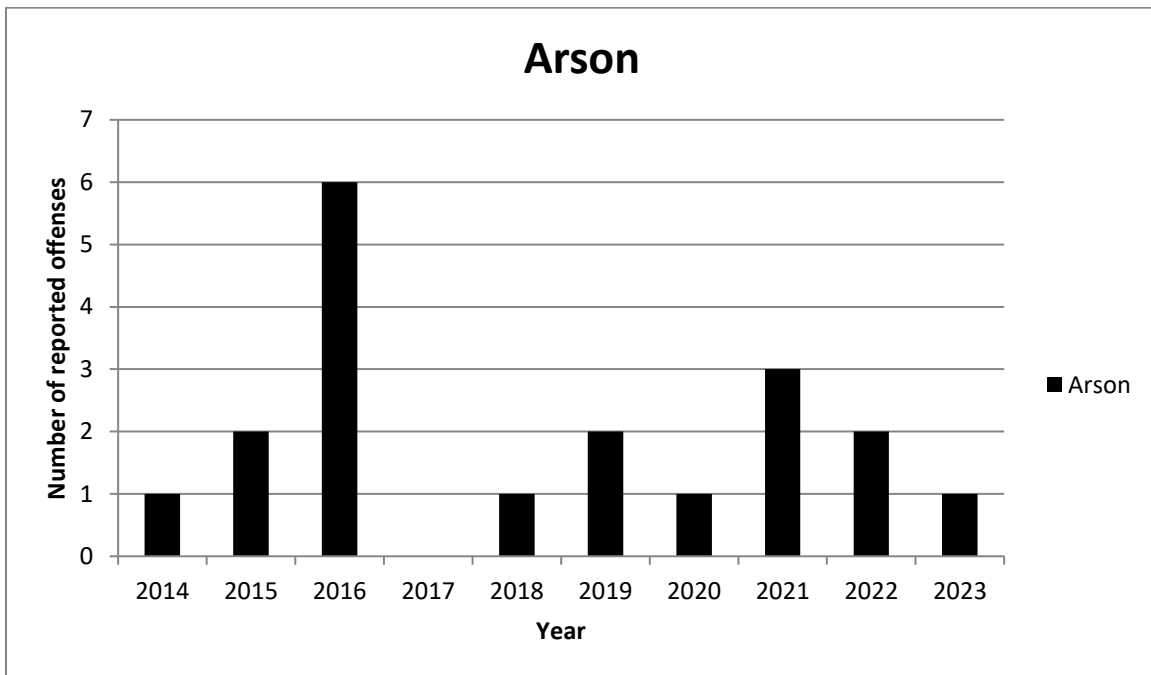
- Two (2) reports were closed by arrest
- One (1) report remains under investigation
- One (1) report was a rape kit turned in by a hospital and the victim wanted to remain anonymous
- In two (2) reports the victim refused to cooperate with any investigation after the initial disclosure
- In the remaining six (6) cases either the elements of the crime did not occur or there was insufficient evidence for criminal charges
- Four (4) involved adult female victims, six (6) involved juvenile female victims, and one (1) juvenile male victim
- The relationship between the victim and suspect was reported as:
 - 5 – Family members
 - 3 – Friends or acquaintances
 - 1 – Met online
 - 3 – Unknown, victim would not disclose details



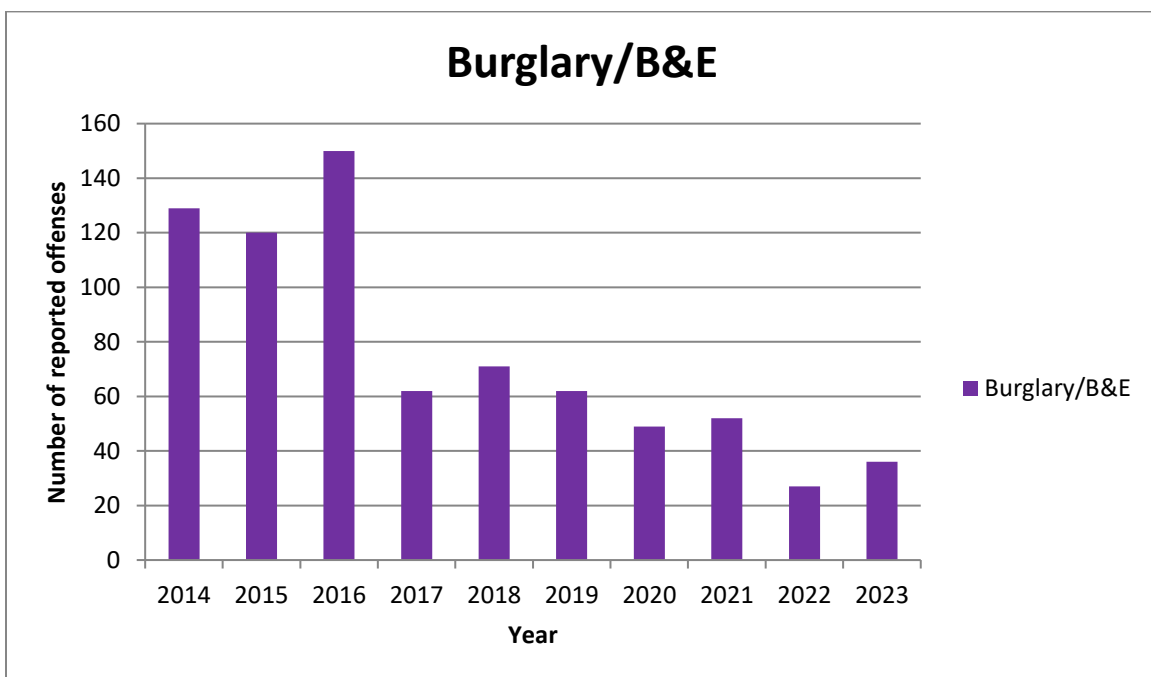
Aggravated Assault: There were 9 reported aggravated assaults in Troy in 2023. Aggravated assaults are defined as those in which serious physical harm is caused, or the victim is threatened with a deadly weapon (gun or knife). This represents a 44% decrease from 2022.



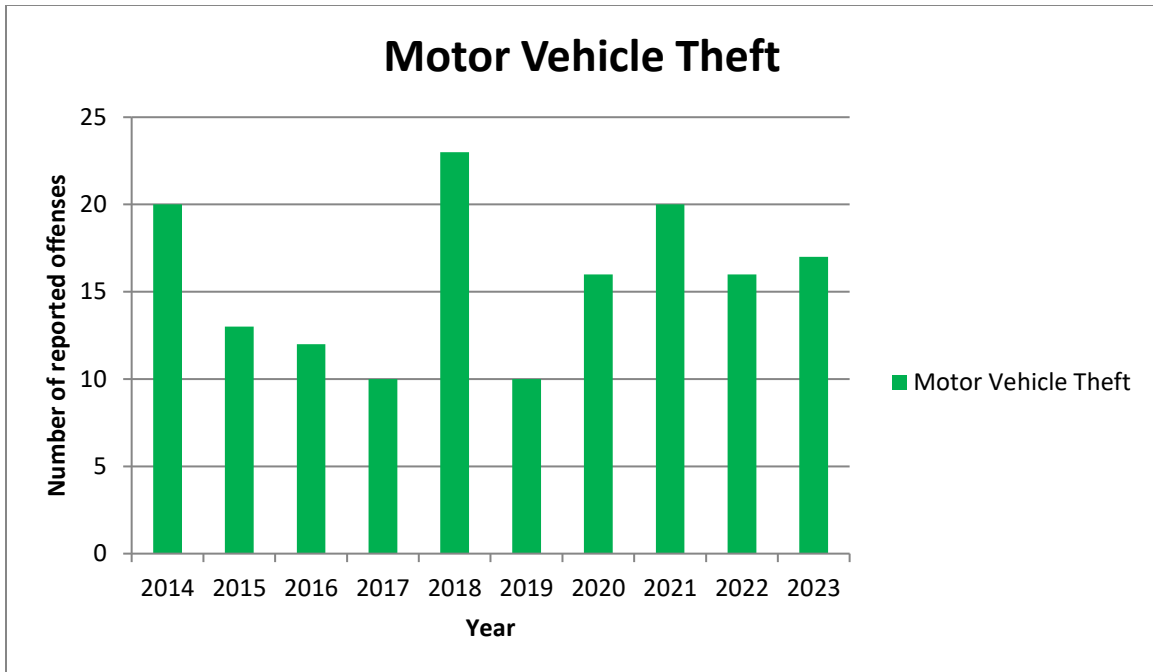
Robbery: There were 6 reported robberies in Troy in 2023 of which four (4) were cleared by arrest. Three occurred at businesses, two (2) near/in residences, and one (1) on the Public Square.



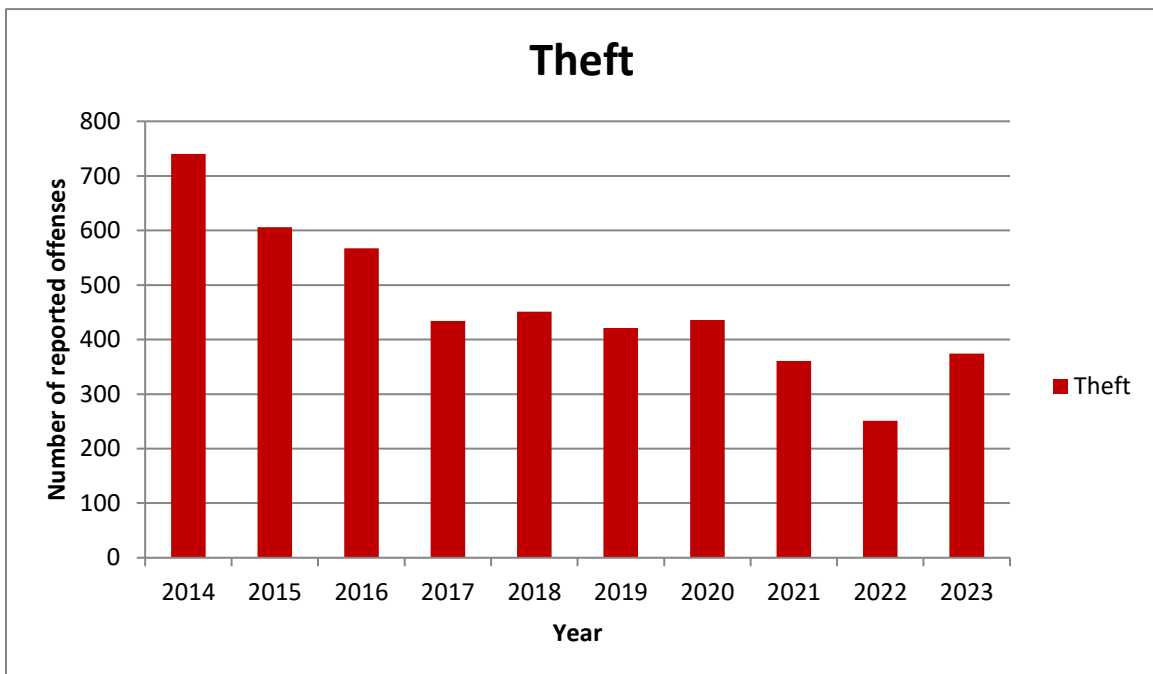
Arson: There was one (1) reported arson in Troy in 2023. The case involved fireworks being placed between the door and screen door of an unoccupied home. Only minor damage to the door occurred.



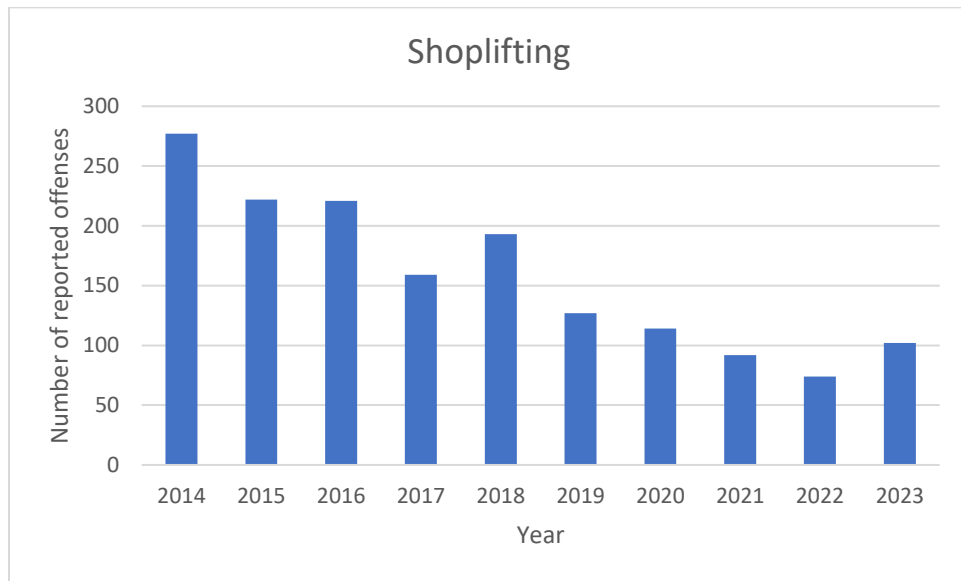
Burglary: There were 36 reported burglaries in Troy in 2023. This represents a 33% increase from 2022.



Auto Theft: There were seventeen (17) reported motor vehicle thefts in Troy in 2023. The makes included 4 Hyundai, 3 Nissan, 3 Ford, 2 Jeeps, and one each of Cadillac, Chrysler, Saturn, Honda, and Ram.



Theft: There were 374 reported thefts in Troy in 2023. This represents a 49% increase from 2022 and a 3% reduction in the past 5-year average.

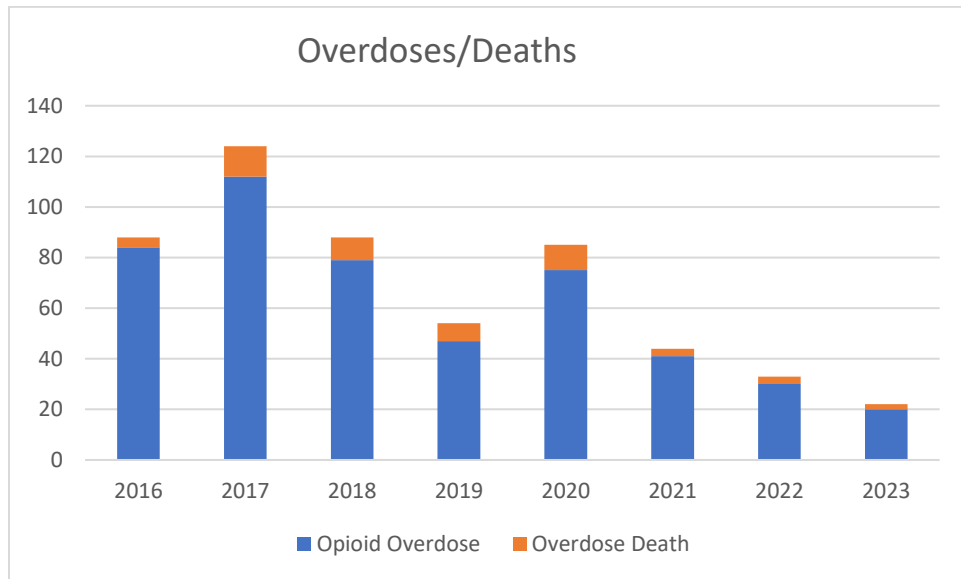


Shopliftings are included in theft reports.

The increase in thefts was also mirrored by the sub-set of shoplifting thefts, included above. Theft is generally reported by the victim, as compared to an “on-view” call by officers.

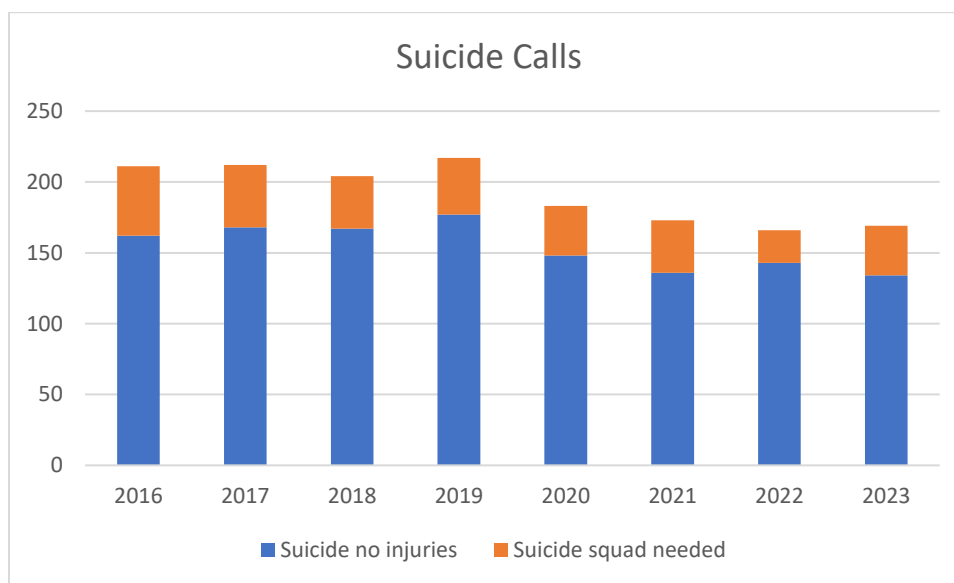
The past years' crime statistics are obtained from the Department's RMS. Previous years are reconciled with statistics reported to the State and FBI. The crimes documented above are those that have traditionally been reported as Part 1 Crimes of the FBI's Uniform Crime Report (UCR). FBI crime statistics are usually not released until the fall of the following year.

Opioid Overdoses/Deaths



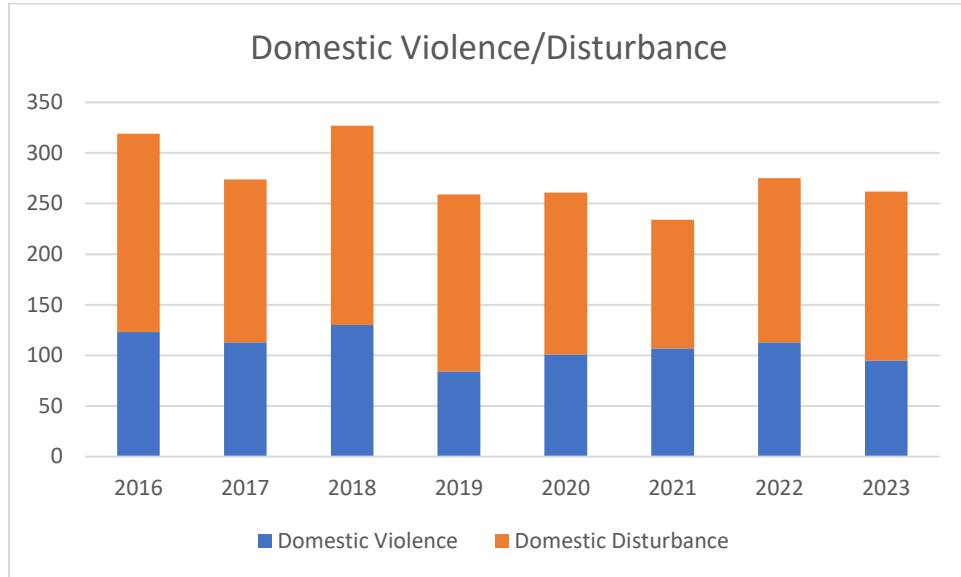
Reported suspected opioid overdoses decreased in 2023. The Police Department continued to participate in the Quick Response Team with Troy FD and the Sunrise Treatment Center in an attempt to bring resources to those who overdosed or have a suspected drug or alcohol addiction. The team attempted to contact 112 individuals in 2023 and contacted 38, Five of whom agreed to receive services. See the attached addendum for more specifics on opioid overdose demographics.

Suicide Calls



Troy officers were dispatched to 169 suicide/attempted suicide calls in 2023. Dispatchers classify these calls into 2 types, suicide without injury and suicide attempts where a squad is needed. In 2023, 134 of these calls did not need a squad and in 35 calls a squad was dispatched to the scene. This only includes calls that are dispatched as suicides/attempted suicides. Officers frequently come across individuals who will tell an officer they are having suicidal thoughts on calls such as welfare checks or after an arrest.

Domestic Violence



In 2023 Troy officers determined that 262 disturbances involved domestic partners or family members. Of those 262 disturbances, 95 were reported as domestic violence, which usually results in an arrest, and 167 were labeled as domestic disturbances, which is defined as having no threats, attempts, or physical harm to a family or household member.

The following pages are provided as references for the number of calls and types of offenses reported to the Troy Police Department in 2023. However, there are key differences in the 2 reports that are explained here.

The first is the “Total CAD Calls Received, by Nature of Call” report. Each documented incident in our Records Management System (RMS) must have a “Call Nature”, but it can only have one. The nature is usually entered by a Dispatcher based upon their knowledge from the reporting person. The officer may change the call nature in our report system, but since only one may be entered, it is the most serious or a general description of the incident.

The second report is the “Law Incident Reports by Offense Codes.” Incident reports may have multiple “Offense Codes” but none are required. The officer completing the report is responsible for entering the “Offense Codes.” This allows for tracking of multiple offenses or issues on the same incident report. For example, an officer arrests a person on a warrant, and in the process of searching the person they find illegal drugs. The officer should enter 2 offense codes, warrant and drug possession.

The list of “Call Natures” is different than “Offense Codes.”
